Sharps injuries are a well-known risk in the healthcare sector. Sharps contaminated with an infected patient's blood can transmit more than 20 diseases, including hepatitis B, C and human immunodeficiency virus (HIV). Because of this transmission risk, sharps injuries can cause worry and stress to the those employees who receive them.



Workers and others in healthcare are at risk. This includes employees who directly handle sharps and employees who may inadvertently be put at risk when sharps are not stored or disposed of correctly.

Health and safety law applies to risks from sharps injuries, just as it does to other risks from work activities.
