

Analysis of Work Related Vehicle Fatalities 2009-2013

This report is based on information gathered by HSA inspectors for work-related vehicle fatality investigations in 2009-2013¹. By law, employers are required to report work related deaths to the Authority².

Summary

There was a total of **240** work related deaths reported to the HSA in 2009-2013¹. **99** of these deaths (41%*) involved work related vehicles (WRV). **76** of these deaths (77%⁺) were workplace transport deaths and **23** (23%⁺) were work related road safety incidents, including driving for work and working on or near the road.

Of the ninety-nine people killed:

- 4 were Female
- **87** were Irish, **9** were 'Other EU'. **3** were 'Outside EU'
- **18** people were in the 65 99 age category
- 6 people were in the 0 − 17 age category
- **20** people were killed using Tractors
- 17 people were killed using trailers of varying types
- The month of July recorded the highest number of WRV deaths with 12 people killed.
- Monday, Wednesday and Saturday were the worst days for WRV deaths, each with 15 people being killed on the respective days.
- County Cork had the highest number of Work Related Vehicle deaths at 15 during 2009-2013

The top two causes of the 99 work related vehicle deaths identified were (1) being hit or run over by a vehicle followed by (2) being crushed between vehicle & object (see Figure 1). **17** (17%⁺) deaths occurred during reversing operations, and **10** (10%⁺) deaths during maintenance operations. **Tractors** were the main type of vehicle involved in vehicle related deaths in 2009-2013, accounting for 20%⁺ of deaths (Figure 3).

The **55-64** year age category was the main group affected by work related vehicle deaths, accounting for 26 (26%⁺) of the deaths (Figure 4). **Self-employed** people accounted for 35 (35%⁺) of the deaths. Non-workers accounted for 12 (12%⁺) of the deaths (Figure 5).

Cork had the highest number of work related vehicle deaths (Figure 6). **Monday, Wednesday and Saturday** were the worst days for work related vehicle deaths (Figure 7). **July** was the month with the most work related transport deaths (Figure 8).

Most of the deaths occurred in small & micro businesses 78%⁺ (Figure 9).

38 of the victims had over 10 years' experience working in their sector (Figure 10). **53** of the victims had over 1 years' experience in their role at the time of incident (Figure 11). The **Agriculture sector** accounted for the highest number of Work Related Vehicle deaths at **33** (33%⁺).

Figure 1: Work Related Vehicle Death Causal Factors 2009-2013




Figure 2: Workplace Related Transport

the Incident




Figure 3: Work Related Transport Deaths 2009-2013: Main Vehicle/Machine Types




Figure 4: Age Category of People killed by Workplace Transport in 2009-2013




Figure 5: Workplace Transport Deaths 2009-60 2013: Status of Person Killed 48 50 40 35 30 20 12 10 3 1 0 Employee Employer

Figure 7: Workplace Transport Deaths 2009-2013 per Day of the Week




Figure 6: Workplace Transport Deaths 2009-2013 per County*





Figure 8: Workplace Transport Deaths 2009-2013 per Month

Figure 9: Workplace Transport Deaths 2009-2013: deaths per organisation size




Figure 11: Workplace Transport Deaths 2009-2013, Victim work experience in Role




Figure 10: Workplace Transport Deaths 2009-2013, Victim work experience in Sector






Figure 12: Workplace Transport Deaths 2009-2013, Accident Victim's Length of Time Working at Accident Location

Work Related Road Deaths

There were 23 work related road deaths recorded by the Authority in 2009-2013, involving 5 professional drivers, 4 Self Employed Farmers, 3 construction workers, 3 members of the public, 2 general operatives in the waste recovery sector, 2 Gardai, 1 postal worker, 1 paramedic, and 1 Child under 17 (non-worker). The vehicles involved were:

- Car
- Van
- HGV
- Road Tanker
- Waste Recovery Vehicle
- Car Transporter

- Bicycle
- Tele-Handler
- Tractor
- Tractor/Trailer combination
- Ambulance

The fatal incident causes were: 9 cases of being hit or run over by a vehicle, 4 cases of falling from vehicle / trailer, 2 cases of entanglement in vehicle-mounted and operated machinery, 2 crashes, 2 cases of vehicle impact, 2 cases of being crushed between a vehicle and an object, and 2 cases of a vehicle overturn.
